The planned special meeting at Easter to ratify our new Patron Shirley Simpson, had to be cancelled due to the pandemic and so it will now happen at our Annual General Meeting in December.

Olive picking this year was cancelled due mainly to the drought and poor fruit set, but in the end with the shut down we would have been unable to pick anyway. Gus and Cec used the time for tougher pruning and

fertilising of the trees and are hopeful for a bumper crop next year.

The Committee have continued to push on with the Strategic Plan Review post COVID. We have made a number of changes already around processes, many that will not affect the members but ensure that the club will be more robust going forward. All tournaments have been reviewed and we now have a comprehensive booklet for new members explaining all the events and competition we run. We have reintroduced the Keeper of the Greens Tournament in a format that will be open to all RBGC members, this was to be held during the lock down but has been rescheduled for November.

Those with a keen eye will notice we have a flag pole and flag in place at the Club. This is thanks to the Brewer family in recognition of Geoff and I think you will agree a wonderful addition to our club.

All match draws have been set and are available on the clubhouse noticeboard (these have also been emailed). Please ensure you play your match on time, finals to be played on 10 October.


Remember, for the Shootout you must submit 5 scores to get on the board.
